Dear Jinsei Yamaguchi:

Thank you for your letter dated November 5, 2004. Unfortunately, it does not appear that we are making any progress in resolving this issue. It is common practice when licensing patents to provide potential licensees with a claim chart. This practice allows the potential licensees to understand how the patent may relate, if at all, to the potential licensee's products. Since you have refused to provide a claim chart, we are still unclear as to exactly why you think your patent claims are relevant to Microsoft's File and Settings Transfer tool. After investigating this issue, it does not appear that your patent could cover the functionality provided by this tool because Microsoft has been providing this same basic functionality since at least as early as 1995. That is more than a year before your patent's earliest filing date. For this reason, we must again request that you please provide a detailed claim chart so that we may understand your position.
